## Scenario 1 Inner city focus

This scenario has most of the growth going into the inner city. It involves apartments up to 15 storeys high in the city centre, and low rise up to six storeys high around Newtown. It has townhouses in the inner suburbs.

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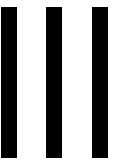
